   and wire transfer or credit card costs will be applied for cancellations received between
   89 to 45 days before the first day of the conference.
- A cancellation fee of 75% of the full registration fee plus a processing fee (€ 20,00)
   and wire transfer or credit card costs will be applied for cancellations received between
   44 to 20 days before the first day of the conference.
- No refund will be issued for cancellations received less than 20 days before the first day
  of the conference.

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


